A 'Golden End' to Dublin Féile Final

The highlight of the Under 14 hurling year was undoubtedly the Féile competition. From a relatively poor start against Na Fianna on the Saturday morning, the team improved in every game, beating St. Vincents in the semi-final and St. Judes by a golden point by Ronan Glynn in an unforgettable second period of extra time in Parnell Park. Preparation for the Féile included a tournament in Dúrlas Óg and challenge games against Ballygunner, Mount Sion, Dicksboro and O'Loughlin Gaels.

Our hosts in the national Féile, Douglas, were superb in every way. We qualified from our group beating Douglas by one point, and Midleton by seven points. We were

marginally beaten by Shelmeliers of Wexford but had already qualified for the semi-final game against Na Piarasigh.

What an epic game this was, played in the superb grounds of Nemo Rangers. The entire squad fought with everything they

had and were three points ahead at half-time. But we were badly hit with some second half injuries and were finally caught with a scoreline 1-7 to 1-4 in favour of Na Piarasigh who went on to be the eventual All-Ireland Féile na nGael winners.

CIAN DURKIN



CIAN DURKIN died on Friday, December 1 after a long, brave battle with illness. Cian was only fifteen years of age when he passed but he had touched the hearts of many during his short life. Cian moved with grace through life and despite the monumental challenges which fate placed in his path he retained a stubbornly positive disposition.

Family was central to Cian's young life. He was loved dearly by his parents, Tara and Paul, his grandparents Tom and Irene, his uncles Colin and Shane and their extended families, and Cian was maturing into a balanced and self-assured young man who clearly valued family and friendship above all else.

Cian was a pupil of Terenure College, a past pupil of St Colmcilles NS and a member of both Ballyboden St Endas GAA club and Knocklyon United FC. He had a real zest for life. Cian may have been slight in frame but he threw himself into all manner of sporting competition, excelling in hurling, soccer and gaelic football and savouring the thrill of winter holidays on the ski slopes. Cian was brimful of enthusiasm and natural curiosity. He possessed a real thirst for knowledge and learning. He excelled in school and turned his hand to drama, guitar and many other extra curricular activities.

Cian's first sporting love was hurling. His young career, inspired by his family's deep love of the game and nurtured in St Colmcilles and the nurseries in Ballyboden St Endas, was rudely interrupted by serious illness in 2001. Cian fought back bravely to become a leader on club U-12, U-13 and U-14 teams. His finest hurling hours came in the summer of 2005. Images of Cian's willowy frame, his dancing feet and those flashing wrists will live forever for those who

witnessed Ballyboden's Feile campaign that summer. The yellow-helmeted little corner forward came up trumps, again and again, during the club's run to the Dublin Feile final and an honourable showing in the All-Ireland Feile in Cork. Though ultimately beaten on the field of play by our gracious hosts St Marys of Mallow, Cian typically came home a winner, having cemented friendships with his Ballyboden team-mates and having forged new friendships with Mallow players. Cian had great faith in friendship and his friends would become a huge source of support during his illness.

Cian's absence leaves a huge void for family, friends, team-mates, club and community but his example and his spirit live on and continue to inspire all of us who were lucky enough to share time with him.

Cian, may flights of angels lead you to your rest.
